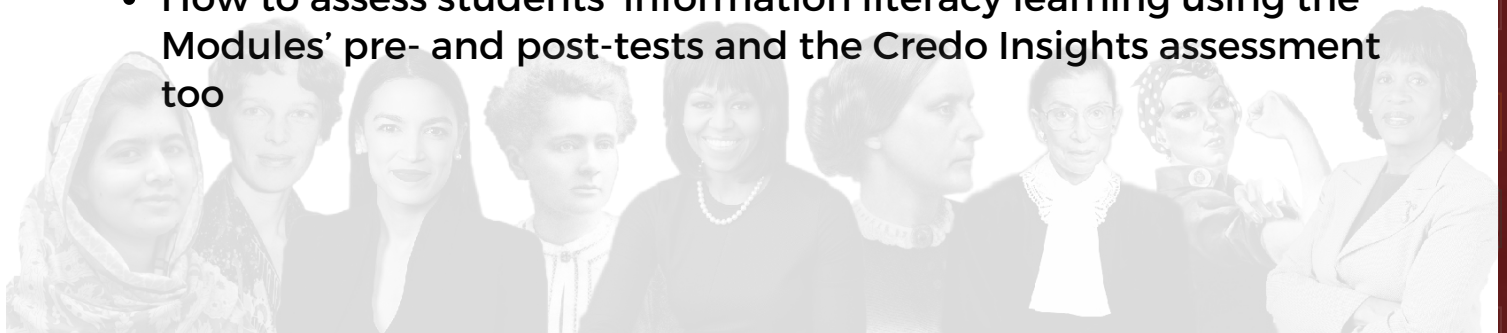
Incorporating InfoLit Modules into Canvas Courses
